A few stand out are as follows:

Lee Van Soest has continued her great efforts with more great captures. In addition Lee also won the *Coast 2 Coast* tuna comp while fishing the 10kg line class exclusively. Well done! Keep at it Lee.

Shaun Ossitt and the '*Overjew*' crew (Wayne Greenshields and new members Jason D'Angelo and Billy Pap-georgiou) are still getting amongst some solid points with over 15,000 points to their credit.

Floss Holder

Getting live baits out as quickly as possible helps keep your baits alive and frisky so they can attract the attention of the big girls. To make sure his mates can get live baits into the water in the shortest time possible, Capt. Jeff Anderson keeps waxed floss and rigging tools close at hand.

Above the rigging station, Anderson mounts a toilet-paper dispenser that holds a large roll of floss beside a selection of hooks and needles. When a bait comes into the boat, the crew can get everything done at one station without running around the cockpit rigging tools. 2 appropriate

A long bolt secured by a wing nut keeps the floss from popping out of the holder in rough seas.



"How do I know if my line will break at the said breaking strain?"

I asked this question of Peter Babarskas from Western Australia recently. Peter is G.F.A.A.'s official line tester. Using the table of specifications of name brand lines and their diameters he measures the line to determine if that particular line is within the breaking strain measurements. To test a line he soaks it in distilled water for 2 hours before testing occurs. It is placed on a machine that pulls the line till it breaks and records this measurement. This is done a minimum of 3 times and no more that 5 times. The end result is averaged and the breaking strain of that line is classified.

For record claims the angler must specify which line class they are applying for and that determines the test results. It must break under the applied line class and above the line class below.

The chart below has the line diameter measurements of the most popular game lines. With Tuna season just around the corner it will be time to check you gear and line. Check that the line is not too old and been effected by the UV rays while in storage. It would be a pity to miss out on an Australian or State record by not checking. The club has a line testing machine that will give you a guide as to what the line on a reel is classed if you have forgotten. This is inside the club rooms and as I said it will be a guide only as it is not certified or measure the line diameter if you know the brand name.

Dear Members,

I hope your all have had a nice X-Mass and New Year.

Thank you to does members who taken up IGFA Membership for only \$40-00 US a year, I am sure you would enjoy the new IGFA year book you received and newsletters in the future, so you can see what happens in fishing anywhere in the world including you can check, on all World Records and there may be some you can break. Give me a call on 0408364488 if you like to join IGFA. I can help you to become a Member quickly.

I have been asked the question many times in regards to scales and world record weighing of Fish and certifying a scale after weighing a Potential World Record.

Question:

I will be going fishing next week in pursuit of an IGFA World Record. However, just realized that my scale has not been certified within the past year, and I will be unable to have it re-certified before embarking on my trip. If i am lucky enough to catch the right fish, would it be within IGFA rules for me to properly weigh and document the fish, and then send in my scale for certification, after the fish has been weighed?

Answer:

This is a great question and one that many anglers encounter, whether they actively pursuing a World Record or not., First of all be IGFA requires that "all scales must be regular checked for accuracy and certified in accordance with applicable government regulations at least once every twelve months. In other words, the scale must be certified every year. That said, IGFA rules also state that "if at the time of weighing the fish the scale has not been properly certified within twelve month, it should be checked and certified for accuracy as quickly as possible "

However, anglers should be aware that if they weigh a fish on the scale that is out of certification, they run the risk of the scale not checking out, in which case, the catch would not be eligible for a World Record. If you should find yourself in this situation, it is a good idea to weigh the fish on another scale, if possible. That way, you have a back-up in case the original scale cannot be certified.

My suggestion is to you, if you have a scale, get it certified every year on regular bases.

Ring me and I will let you know ,where you can go.

The G.F.C. of S.A. started a historical photo album of captures of fish from members, fishing personalities and boat pictures from 1937, but it is not up to date and is incomplete.


We have photos from members back to approximately 1977.

A few weeks ago club weight recorder Wayne Greenshields and I were offered the opportunity to join club secretary Rolf Czabayski for a few days fishing onboard his O25ft vessel 'Galaxy Star'. Rolf has an enviable reputation of being able to rack up some serious Southern Blue fin Tuna numbers throughout the fishing season and to be honest I was keen to see just how he and his crew go about it.

After a short drive is Wayne's new 300c 'weapon' (and I mean short!) we arrived in Lincoln and we joked Rolf already had the engines running, we planned on steaming around to Memory Cove that evening and onward to the Cabbage patch the following day. It was pretty smooth sailing hugging the coastline westward and we were soon tight on the anchor and filling the live bait tank with Eyre Peninsula's finest tommies. I had secretly devised a plan for these the following day if we could convince Rolf to stop over one of the pinnicles and drop for whatever was showing on his big twin Simrads 19" screens.

As it tuned out the Tuna bite was good and we racked up around 20 fish mostly on 6kg nylon before the mid-morning bite waned.



I had been watching showings of bigger fish deep on the ledges that fringe 'the patch' and I eventually convinced Rolf to let me have a drop.

I don't think anyone has clamed down the Galaxy star ladder as quickly as I did that morning, and in a nano second a medium sized Tommie was rigged and dispatched to the bottom.



The take was instant and I was soon tight to what turned out to be my first Samson fish, only a pup by the species standards, but I didn't care. Rolf and Wayne could see my excitement and I snipped the live bait rig straight off handed it to Wayne so he could have a go whilst I rigged a 200g Daiwa sacrifice jig. They loved this too, as did a handful of good sized Trevally.



Unfortunately we thought the boat didn't have any pink tags onboard so I missed the opportunity of my 9th species for the year. It didn't matter though as when I turned to the opposite corner Wayne was on and getting 'railed' on 10kg dacron.

He eventually boated that fish and although i went 500g or so short of line class it was still a great first capture Samson fish. Rolf even got in on the act boating one around 8kg on 10kg dacron. We didn't find the monster we were chasing, but I did get two big bust offs. One on the jig and another on the final live bait drop of the day. We ended up boating around 10 Samson fish and a half a doz good sized trevs and a few kick-ass nannies. Life was good.





The afternoon Tuna bit was slower this day so we tucked into Williams Island for the night with expectations high for an Eagle Ray and possibly a Shark. Darkness was upon us when my 3kg outfit screamed off with 17.5kg of Eagle Ray attached, despite heckling from Rolf, well needed support from Wayne and three or four laps of the boat, I boated that Eaglie and at 5.83:1 ratio, it currently leads the most meritorious standings for that species in the O25ft category.

After dinner Wayne retired for bed and Rolf was down in the engine room, I decided to rig my shark line. I have tried locally a few times this year without turning a reel. To be honest I was unsure if I was doing things right, but to my amazement I baited a Tuna bloodline onto a *Top Shot tackle* 10/0 shark rig, making sure I trimmed the bait to allow good hook exposure and drifted it back to the edge of light cast by Galaxy star's overhead deck lights.

The bite was almost instant and I was tight and loosing line fast. "Im on Rolf' I yelled down into the engine room cavity- "what" he replied, I'm sure in disbelief.

To cut a long story short, I played a safe hand, taking things easy on this, my first good Bronze Whaler Shark. One hour and fifteen minutes later we were able to secure the Shark and its vitals were recorded.

I was exhausted, a combination of a prolonged fight time, dehydration, sunstroke and probably one too many beers with dinner had me well and truly shattered. Afterwards I was in shock and on a high at the same time, it was brought to my attention that I had capture a game fish, tagged a game fish, captured an Eagle Ray and captured a Shark all in the space of 14 hours.

Wayne and Rolf both re-iterated the fact that this feat is amazing but I was a bit shocked and it certainly took a while to sink in. Galaxy Star is now in the running for Champion Boat, and I am also in the running for Champion male O25ft, despite owning a vessel under 25ft.

I would like to take this opportunity to publically thank both Wayne and Rolf, who assisted with the capture.



Create Yourself a Species Record Kit

One of the great things about fishing is that every time you go, you have a chance to catch a world record. So whether you are in pursuit of a record, or just catch one by accident, it is always best to be prepared. Here are a few things you might want to keep on hand during every trip:

Camera



A waterproof, shockproof digital camera with good resolution for images is best.

The IGFA requires that pictures be submitted with each world record application. It is best to use a digital camera with at least 3 megapixel resolution and provide a flash drive or disk with the photos to the IGFA or just email them to jvitek@igfa.org. As a last resort print your digital pictures on high quality photo paper. Do not send in digital pictures that have been printed on plain paper unless the printer is capable of printing quality photographs on quality photo paper. These photographs may be used for the IGFA publications, Facebook page, e-newsletter, and the IGFA website.

A flash drive or CD is best for mailing the images of your potential world record to the IGFA World Records Department.

Scale and/or Measuring Devices

A high-quality scale is good to have so that you accurately know how big your catch is. For records though, you'll need to have its accuracy certified. You can send your scale to the IGFA headquarters where, for a fee, we will test it, and if it passes, will certify it. If the scale used was not certified at the time of the catch, you can mail the scale along with the application and the IGFA will examine it as stated above. You may also weigh your fish on a certified scale at one of the IGFA Official Weight Stations, all of which can be located on the IGFA's online interactive map (http://www.igfa.org/Maps/Default.aspx).



As the IGFA length record category is relatively new, there is great opportunity for catching fish that would apply here. You can pick up an official measuring device from the IGFA's online store at http://store.igfa.org/



Access to current records



With IGFA membership, you can visit the IGFA website at any time to view and print out the current records, as well as any that may be pending (if you are targeting a specific species). For even easier access, you can also download the IGFA App for your Apple device and have all of the records at your fingertips, right when you need them.

World Record Application



The application can be downloaded from the IGFA website at www.igfa.org. Be familiar with the questions it asks for so that you don't miss any steps, especially if you don't want to keep the application with you. In that case, be sure to have paper and a pencil to write down the details of the catch.


Dry bag



You might want to put all of these items into a bag or storage container that will keep them dry. It would be tragic if you caught a potential record, photographed it, and then the camera got wet and you were not able to submit the application.

Go Catch a Record

Now that you know what items you need in your record kit, that amazing catch won't just be another fishing story; it'll be one for the record books!

RADITIONALLY, BIG-GAME fishermen connected their main line to the leader with a snap swivel, which was tied directly to the end of the line or to a section of doubled line from a Bimini twist. Whatever connector you used, it only needed to be as strong as the doubled line since, until the mate got a grip on the leader, the pressure applied to the snap swivel connection wouldn't go beyond the double line strength.

For decades the strongest leader anyone used was 0.035-inch-diameter tinned music wire. Most healthy young wire men could, with protec-

tive gloves, hold on tight enough to break the 330-pound wire. For this wire to break, the mate must be stretched out past the danger point. There may be some mates out there who can break 0.035 piano wire with partially bent arms, but I have never met one.

Everything changed when monofilament leaders came into vogue. Most billfish crews now use ridiculously strong leader material to have enough residual strength left to let a mate control the fish, even after the fish's bill has chafed the leader. The bigger the marlin and the longer the fight, the greater the initial strength of the leader needs to be. Unfortunately, this

can result in a potentially dangerous situation if the mate can't break the leader in an emergency.


With the advent of wind-on leaders, connections between the wind-on leader and the trace leader needed to be stronger, much stronger, than the ones previously used to connect the double line to the leader. Since the swivel connection is down close to the fish with wind-on leaders, it must be able to bear the brunt of a strong wire man who's tugging on 500-pound mono. Some of the commonly used swivels and snaps did not make the grade and failed under the stresses generated by adrenaline-stoked mates.

These days I see more and more crews forgoing the use of a snap swivel and crimping both the wind-on leader and the trace leader directly to a plain, heavy-duty swivel. Having spent a couple of weeks with a giant testing machine breaking crimped connections, I have wondered if this was not a case of jumping out of the frying pan and into the fire.

I reasoned that since most crews often use mismatched sleeves and crimping tools, they might actually wind up with a weaker connection between the two sections of leader than if they'd use a swivel connection. Since most amateurs have a much better chance of getting one crimp done well than getting several to hold properly, I decided to test some swivels, snaps and other connections to see how they stood up under the pressure of heavy-tackle leaders.

Also of major importance is the consideration of speed in making lure or bait changes. Speed is a major factor in separating the best from the rest, and one of the highest accolades a professional deckhand can acquire is a reputation for being fast. A good snap swivel or other quick-change device takes a small fraction of the time to change a lure or natural bait than recrimping does.

We tested three kinds of swivels: the basic barrel, torpedo and ball-bearing swivels. We also tested to destruction four different quick-change connectors from a variety of sources. Most came from an enormous box full of snap swivels left over from an old photo shoot. This replicated a situation you might find on almost any boat since most snaps and swivels are not kept in their original packs, and manufacturing standards differ widely.



Common Snap Swivels

Our first test was on an ordinary snap swivel. We chose a big, good-looking snap and swivel from our overflowing box. Steve Carl at Hi-Liner Fishing Supply assured me it was most definitely a SAMPO swivel and the largest size they made. We did not know who made the wire snap. Just looking at them I would have trusted both snap and

the snap, it finally broke at a savage 730 pounds.

Since most anglers cannot attain 400-pound crimped connections in even 500-pound leader, I would use and recommend this snap and swivel even in the middle of a wind-on leader, if it was all that was available. (See "Regular Trolling Snaps.")

Leg Splitters


Nowadays I always use wind-on leaders when seeking giant marlin. I need a strong connection that can take the heat my young, healthy mates put on a leader when we have a monster marlin alongside the boat. Lately, for this purpose I've used the Hi-Catch ball-bearing swivel with the Escape Proof snap that my boys commonly refer to as a "leg splitter." (See "Escape Proof.")

We tested several of these swivels

and connectors that were rated at 500 pounds. The worst result, which was still a good one, was a failure at 475 pounds — four other tests hung in anywhere from 485 pounds to 580 pounds. Failure over 500 pounds occurred on both legs of the connector and the stem of the swivel through which a ring is passed. One swivel we tested without the leg-splitter snap finally broke at 1,050 pounds.

Split legs with a lower rating still use the same connector until they get under 250 pounds, then they just switch to using smaller swivels. All sizes of the Hi-Catch ball-bearing swivels usually tested over their rating or at worst were a only few pounds under.

In the really miniature sizes, the tiny leg splitter used would limit the size of the leader that could be connected to it, but is way stronger than



Escape Proof

When Ed DuBois, inventor of the Escape Proof split leg swivel, first sent me some of his new, unusual looking connectors, I figured from the way that they looked they would be stronger than normal snaps. I gave them a try in Cairns, but after a bit of use, they would become very loose and the legs would swing freely with little friction. On rough days, we lost of couple of natural baits and their hooks that we had rigged on single-strand wire. The loop in the wire leader pushed the legs open when the bait tugged and jerked from the motion of the outrigger in the choppy seas, and then the

wire fell off the open snap.

Fortunately, we never lost a fish because of this, and although we found we could indeed pull plenty hard on this connector, we were afraid to keep using them. We used the same large ball-bearing swivel but switched to small, 5/32-inch stainless-steel shackles to make leader changes. (See "Shackles.")

About three years ago, Hi-Liner's John Drouet showed me how to "tune" the connectors my mates call "leg splitters." By using a hand-crimping tool to squeeze the grommet that goes through both legs, you can adjust the friction so the legs can be quickly and easily opened to change baits or lures but will not open up by mistake in even the roughest weather. We have not lost a fish in the past three years through any

failure of these ball-bearing swivels with the unusual looking connector. I recommend them highly.

the swivel that designates the rating.


This is a consistently strong device that also allows quick and easy changes of leaders. I recommend it for the heaviest tackle and the biggest fish in the ocean.

Pigtails


The biggest disappointment of our day's testing came when we tested "pigtails." This is a device I first saw in Hawaii years ago and have used all over the world in years since. The pigtail is supposed to have the advantage of never having a leader loop fall out of its grasp, and I have never heard of this happening. On the downside, pigtails are large, heavy and look like something a wahoo or barracuda would love to strike.

The heavy pigtails on Yo-Zuri 9-mm swivels were plenty strong (they

While they may fit the bill for light-tackle applications, pig tails should stay in the box when you're pursuing larger billfish.



We also tested two SAMPO pigtails from our box. We were able to wind our leader loops onto their lighter wire curlicues, but they failed, by straightening out, at a mild-mannered 175 and 200 pounds. I would not use them on large marlin or tuna.





Aussie Haywire

I had seen, but never used, a clever-looking device called a Aussie Haywire connector and swivel. To make these devices, ultraheavy wire is twisted in a haywire wrap, like the one we create when making loops in single-strand wire leader, with a double-barreled sleeve slipped down over the tag end of the wrap. There is no



"Regular" Trolling Snaps & Swivels

The most commonly used style of snap swivel has one simple drawback: Under just the wrong set of conditions, it's possible for the loop of the leader to twist inside the loop of the snap and pull on the snap in a way that opens the snap connection. Most pros, myself included, have at one time or another caught a fish where the snap was open but still held the leader.

I have used snap swivels in the middle of wind-on leaders, but I usually try to have the snap far enough from the hook to keep it from pressing up against the fish during the course of the fight and popping open.

On the positive side, using a good, strong snap swivel makes a huge difference in the speed in which changes can be made. This quickness can radically increase your catch rate with only a very rare fish being lost due to a snap opening in the midst of a fight.

Interestingly, giant bluefin tuna anglers often use "tuna snaps" without the swivel even though the swivel, either barrel or ball-bearing, is actually stronger than the snap. The rationale is that the swivel's larger size, weight and visu-

al profile lower the chance of getting a tuna bite. In the Bahamas, the large profile of a snap swivel might also draw the attention of the ever-present barracudas, which may mistake the swivel for a small baitfish and cut you off.

All the swivels we tested that had ratings posted tested nearly as much or more than their rated strength, with the exception of one 300-pound swivel that

had a ring break at 110 pounds (stuff happens). Every other swivel we tested, including several more of the one that failed prematurely, held up sensationally.



Shackles

If you find yourself short on any kind of good quick-change connector but have plenty of heavy-duty swivels, there is an easy way out. Head down to any good marine hardware store (West Marine and Lewis Marine are two examples), especially if small sailboats are popular in the area. Buy some of the smallest stainless-steel shackles you can find (I prefer 5/32inch). Use the shackle as a connection between the swivel ring and the loop of your leader. We prefer the

shackles that use a flat pin to the kind with a slit head. My boys always carry their fishing pliers but rarely have a screwdriver in their pocket. After a quick turn from their pliers, we've never had a failure of any kind over the many years we've used them in Cairns.

We stopped our lone test on three interconnected shackles at 1,300 pounds, and although they were slightly twisted out of shape and couldn't be opened, they were still hanging tough.

Shackles hold up incredibly well under tremendous pressures and also make it easy for mates to change baits quickly.

would not be afraid to use the smaller Aussie Haywire devices, and there is no fear of it accidentally opening. Its slim profile in connection with a torpedo-shaped swivel is attractive to some anglers and crews who fear a larger swivel and connector may detract from their ability to get strikes.

chance of a leader getting free from this connector.

However, the heaviest Aussie Haywire, which was rated at 600 pounds, was almost impossible to open, and the initial effort required even strong-handed men to use pli-

ers. After three or four openings and closings, it did become a bit easier to work. A strong man could do it without pliers, but it wasn't easy. Women and boys would have trouble trying to make leader changes with this device, and you could forget about doing it with any

The 600-pound Aussie Haywire did not reach its advertised strength but would have been acceptable at a 500-pound rating since it failed at 485, 475 and 580 pounds. The Yo-Zuri 9-mm swivel (which was not rated in pounds) never failed with the Haywire Aussie connected to it. When, during later tests on swivels, we tested it solo, the Yo-Zuri 9-mm broke at 525 and 650 pounds. The 9mm Yo-Zuri swivel, combined with a 600-pound Aussie Haywire connec-

The 400-pound Aussie Haywire worked much better as a quick-change connector. After a slightly difficult first opening, we could open and close it fairly easily with bare hands. It almost lived up to its rated strength and failed at 370 and 360 pounds.

tion, makes for a strong device, but it can be difficult and slow to use.

This is a better connector for serious marlin fishermen, and any mate who breaks one is way too strong and macho for his own good.

Use Common Sense

I would prefer to have a connection, or a leader, that can be broken in an emergency but still allows a healthy young mate to pull as hard as he can with slightly bent arms. We will be rethinking our rigs with the information we now have on the strength of our connectors.

Anglers and crews targeting the smaller species of billfish use much lighter leader than we have discussed above and often want the leader to break fairly easily to facilitate releasing the fish. They often use a trace leader with a lower breaking strain than the wind-on section to avoid having to rerig the fairly complex wind-on leader. The breaking strain of any connector used is not as big a factor on light tackle, and most any of the low-priced snap swivels that carry a rating above that of the breakaway trace section are plenty strong enough.

If you really are looking for monsters and want or feel like you need something unbreakable by even the strongest mate, use a small, 5/32-inch stainlesssteel shackle to connect your unbreakable leader to a big torpedo swivel and carry lots of insurance.




build a lot of hook-sets and go to great pains to try to keep my lures and hook-sets from spinning up the line. Lures will twist up your fishing line if your swivels seize or if your lure head spins freely against the hook-set. (Many lures, like Bart Miller's, use a rubber grommet to keep the set from turning under the lure.)

A spinning lure looks terrible in the water, and the resulting twist can severely weaken your line. Also, once you get any slack in a spun-up section of line, it's going to twist up and catch

on anything nearby, especially your rod tip. After spending several days in Cabo watching our offerings spin like tops, I tried an old trick to see if the lures were actually twisting the line.

Simply grab the section of line that runs between the first stripper guide and reel, with one hand close to the reel and one hand close to the guide. Now move your hands together. If the line twists into a kink, you know that either your swivel is trashed or your lures are spinning. Either way, something's going to have to change.

Tie Right On

While I usually follow most manufacturers' warnings to a T, you can tie braided line straight to your reel spool, your swivel or whatever.

When tying superbraids to your reel's spool, wrap the line around the spool four or five times and secure with a five-wrap uni-knot — it isn't going anywhere. When tying to your swivel, go

through the ring twice and tie with your favorite knot using a couple of extra wraps. There's no need to splice in sections of mono every time you need to make a connection.

Get the Most from Your Backing

Winter makes a good tiny maintenance chores summer bite.

One of the first things I do at time to catch up on all the the end of the season is reverse the Dacron or superbraid backing on all that get ignored during the my reels. If you catch your tackle outfitter during the slow winter season, he can unspool and reverse

your backing much faster than you can do it by hand. Always break out a scale and check your breaking strength before you put the backing back on the reel.

If you do it yourself, before you respool soak the backing material in a 5-gallon bucket of fresh water with a cup of fabric softener mixed in. Let it drain off and dry for 24 hours — it should still be slightly damp. Repack with the damp line using gloves to make sure you get it on tight. About every one-fourth spool I like to do an extreme wigwag across the spool to prevent the line from binding or sinking down into itself. You can get at least twice the life out of your backing in this way - and we all know how expensive that stuff is!



GFAA Award Pins

MERIT PINS FOR CAPTURE

Merit Pins may be awarded to anglers for captures made in Australian waters and recorded in each of the various line classes according to the tables below.

GFAA shall design and control the issue of such Capture Merit Pins, which shall be engraved with the initials GFAA and be symbolic of the fish for which the award is made. Club secretaries shall, by the authority of GFAA, order and distribute Capture Merit Pins to club members who have submitted to them a written application supported by relevant Capture and Weight Recording Certificates.

State branches shall advise GFAA by July 15 each year the number and each type of Capture Merit Pins so distributed.

Only one Capture Merit Pin for each species and for each line class may be issued to any one angler during any one year ending June 30.

It is recommended that Capture Merit Pins be presented at club annual general meetings, presentation of trophy evenings, or similar occasions.

Note: the cost of the Capture Merit Pins shall be borne by the angler.

MERIT PINS FOR TAG AND RELEASE

Merit Pins may be awarded to tag and releases effected in Australian waters. The eligibility rating is listed below.

GFAA shall design and control the issue of such Merit Pins, which shall be engraved with the initials GFAA and may be symbolic of the fish for which the award is made.

Club secretaries shall, by the authority of GFAA, order and distribute Tag and Release Merit Pins to club members who have submitted to them a written application supported by relevant documentation. Details should include:

(a) species of fish

- (b) dates of Tag and Release
- (c) serial number of tag cards submitted to NSW State Fisheries

State branches shall advise GFAA by July 15 of each year the number and each type of Tag and Release Merit Pins so distributed.

Tag and Release Merit Pins are retrospective to the start of record keeping by the NSW Fisheries Research Institute.

It is recommended that Tag and Release Merit Pins be presented at club annual general meetings, presentation nights, or similar occasions.

The cost of the Tag and Release Merit Pin

shall be borne by the angler.



- a cheque for \$110.00 (inc. GST) for the issue of the cap and framed certificate.





SHARK, BRONZE WHALER


Scientific name *Carcharhinus brachyurus.* Also known as Copper shark, cocktail shark.





Description A fairly common shark of offshore waters, but which occasionally enters large embayments. The bronze whaler is dangerous and has been responsible for several fatalities in Australia. The bronze whaler is very similar to the black or whaler shark but the bronze whaler generally has a bronze or coppery colour, which fades to grey after death. The upper teeth are narrow and slightly concave on this species. The bronze whaler lacks the distinctive skin ridge running between the two dorsal fins which is present on the black whaler. The bronze whaler reaches 3.25 m and more than 200 kilograms.

Fishing The bronze whaler can be taken with a variety of live or dead fish baits, large cut baits and squid. Bronze whalers are attracted by berley and can be found around boats, usually showing up as catch rates improve. The fight of the bronze whaler is strong and dogged, in common with many sharks. A wire or steel trace is essential. The bronze whaler makes good eating and smaller specimens are often used by fish and chip shops.
